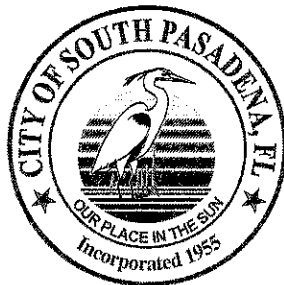

CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT made this _____ day of January, 2014, by and between the **CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, FLORIDA**, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY", as party of the first part and _____, hereinafter referred to as the "SPECIAL MASTER" as party of the second part, both of whom understand as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to engage Professional Services of the SPECIAL MASTER to serve as the CITY's special magistrate hearing officer for red light camera traffic infractions and for supplemental code enforcement process for the CITY; and

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to set the conditions of engagement and set understandings with respect to such services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

SECTION 1. DUTIES

The CITY engages the SPECIAL MASTER to perform those functions and duties necessary for: (i) supplemental code enforcement process for the City of South Pasadena as set forth and defined in CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, FLORIDA ORDINANCE NO. 2012-06; and (ii) to perform the duties as the CITY's designated Local Hearing Officer for red light camera traffic infraction hearing conducted pursuant to the requirements of Section 4 of Chapter 2013-160, Laws of Florida amending Chapter 316, Florida Statutes.

SECTION 2. TERM

The Term of this Agreement shall commence on the date hereof and shall continue until either the CITY or the SPECIAL MASTER give written notice to terminate subject to the transition period set forth in SECTION 4 hereof.

SECTION 3. CONDITIONS AND COMPENSATION

- A. All fees will be billed on an hourly basis at the rate of _____ per hour. Time is billed by the tenth (1/10) of an hour (0.1 hour = 6 minutes, etc.).
- B. SPECIAL MASTER will be reimbursed for all reasonable out-of-pocket expenses associated with the services performed pursuant to his duties as described above for the CITY, excluding mileage for travel to and from City Hall where hearings will be conducted.

- C. The SPECIAL MASTER shall bill the CITY monthly for fees, costs and expenses incurred during the previous month. All invoices will be paid within thirty (30) days of receipt by the CITY.

SECTION 4. TERMINATION AND TRANSITION

In the event either the CITY or the SPECIAL MASTER give notice of termination of this agreement the parties hereto agree to a sixty (60) day transition period from the date of notice before the termination shall be deemed effective to provide time for appointment of a replacement to the SPECIAL MASTER.

SECTION 5. REPRESENTATION AND CONFLICTS

The SPECIAL MASTER recognizes the need for neutrality in the hearing process, and that timely and effective hearing times are an essential element of this contract.

Therefore, the SPECIAL MASTER expressly understands and agrees that in the event of an actual or a potential conflict of interest between the SPECIAL MASTER and any other person or organization who may appear before the SPECIAL MASTER, the SPECIAL MASTER will promptly notify all parties when such conflict of interest becomes known, and provide a duly qualified substitute hearing officer should any party request a recusal of the SPECIAL MASTER.

The SPECIAL MASTER shall perform his duties in accordance with Florida Statutes and Ordinances of the CITY governing both local code enforcement procedures and adjudication of red light camera traffic infractions.

SECTION 6. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. The text herein shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties.
- B. This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to benefit of the heirs at law of the SPECIAL MASTER.
- C. SPECIAL MASTER shall have the status of an independent contractor of the CITY and shall not be considered to be an employee of the CITY in performance of duties under this Agreement.



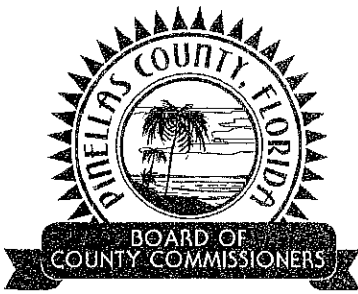
